A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM FATHER RICHARD

My prayer for all of you and yours this Christmas and throughout the New Year is our Franciscan greeting of Peace and Goodness! Each year at the crèche we are flooded with childhood memories. The past was a simpler time when we believed because the grace of our imagination led the way. The manger scene was alive with the baby Jesus because we were captivated and transported from earth to heaven. The Christ child is real ever since our God came from heaven to be with us here on earth. The incarnation of the Word made Flesh is just as real today as He was on that first Christmas. St. Francis of Assisi brought the incarnation alive in the imagination of his contemporaries in the first live crèche at Greccio. 

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults



My religious upbringing began in a non-denominational church. Part of my upbringing included that Catholicism (and any other denomination of Christianity) was wrong. When I was 13, my parents divorced and I stopped attending church. My religious education and relationship with God came to a screeching halt. Twelve years later, I met my husband, who is Catholic. On one of our first dates, he told me that he could not pursue the relationship any further, unless I knew (and agreed) going into it that we would be getting married in the Catholic Church, and that our future children would be Catholic. I agreed, with the one stipulation that I myself didn't have to become Catholic. I attended Mass with my husband and in-laws, but with a very closed heart.

Fast forward a few years, and my husband and I tried to get pregnant. Almost immediately, we knew something was wrong. Three doctors confirmed it: infertility. We were suffering. We wanted so badly to have a baby. I really had not given God much thought, much attention, and I rarely prayed. It came to me like a startling epiphany, that maybe this was God's way of bringing me back to the Church. I didn't have a clue where to start, so I found an online book titled 30 Days of Prayer through Infertility. We did end up having a daughter, Kaylee, in 2016. I started attending Bible studies and attending other events at the various churches. I was hungry for the relationship with Christ, but still, nothing was really "sticking."

Meanwhile, we started talking about having a second child, and baptizing our second child. In my religious frustration, I decided that I needed to learn as much about Catholicism as possible - NOT because I wanted to become Catholic. I wanted to know exactly what my children were going to be "brainwashed" with, and quite frankly, I wanted to be able to be able to argue with my husband about why Catholicism was wrong.

I read a few books on Catholicism and a ton of blog articles discussing the differences between Protestants and Catholics. This religion that I had been so shut off to for the past 32 years made sense. A lot of what I thought I knew were misconceptions - and a lot of things I didn't previously understand made sense once explained. I started praying that God would lead me in the right direction, and would help me open my heart and mind to whatever denomination or religion he wanted me to be.

One of the mom's groups that I was in was Archangels at Good Shepherd. One day while I was there, a woman was talking to the group about how excited she was that her husband was going through RCIA. She invited me several times to join them at RCIA. I scheduled a meeting with Father Ron. During our meeting, I said "I grew up knowing Catholicism is wrong, and I should be against it, and now I'm starting to think that I was the one who was wrong." He laughed and agreed that I WAS the one in the wrong! He invited me to join Inquiry.

Several weeks later, my husband and I were sitting in our living room and I said, "Lane, I met with Father Ron at Good Shepherd, and I am pretty sure that I want to become Catholic... and I was wondering if you'd be okay with joining me at classes on Monday nights, because I'm too scared to go by myself." Lane almost fell out of his chair. He had no idea that I had been reading all of the books, and that I had gone on this discovery mission by myself. He was thrilled, and told me that he and his family had been praying that in my own time I would make this decision on my own.

My first day of Inquiry, I told the leaders, "I'm 98% sure I want to become Catholic, I just need you to push me that extra 2%." They laughed, and said they refused to do any pushing, that the Holy Spirit would have to do that. Very quickly, He did.

After four years of searching for a religious home and searching to figure out how to begin a relationship with God, I am proud and confident in my decision to become Catholic. I believe God knows my stubborn side, and knew that I needed to go down this long, not necessarily straight, path in order to allow myself to have a strong relationship with him.

With God in the picture, my marriage is stronger and closer than ever. While I would never wish infertility (or any other form of suffering) on another person, I can now look back and be thankful for all of the heartache and tears that led me to the place I am now. I'm amazed how much lighter I feel knowing that God is on my side, and that prayer is the first line of defense, not the last possible option. I look forward to standing in front of God alongside my husband and daughters in the Catholic Church.
